President's Message

Wishing you a blessed Christmas season, a hopeful & joyous New Year in 2014! As we begin the New Year, I'm reminded of the past; all the members present and before us who have given of themselves and contributed to this organization, since 1884.

As a student of history, I continue to be amazed about the struggles and success of the Irish people; the pride of our local heritage/tribe-surname/Club or sub-part of County Cork, the Immigrant spirit of nationalism for both native Ireland and adopted country and home within the USA, the organized contributions of the collective Irish experiences to society within Labor, Politics, the Military, the Archdiocese and charitable organizations, such as the County Cork Benevolent Patriotic and Protective Association.

I'm honored to be a part of continuing this legacy, and to benefit from networking, making great friends, learning and socializing with some of the best people in the Irish American community.

Looking through the 125th Anniversary edition journal, a book replete with the history of this organization, I'm amazed at the challenges and successes of the generations before us. Turning through these journal pages, I learn how Past President Sean Keating (Kanturk) was a founding member of the Irish Institute, holding numerous official positions in New York City and the US Government, as well as becoming Grand Marshal to the NYC St. Patrick's Day Parade in 1956. The legacy continues as our 125th Anniversary honoree – Jack Ahern (Brooklyn & Kilbrittain) marches up Fifth Avenue as the Grand Marshal of the 253rd NYC St. Patrick's Day Parade this year in 2014. The Irish Institute continues today under the direction and expertise of Jim Lombard, who also served New York City with honor and distinction in the New York City Council.

I read further of the success of the Cork Ladies Auxiliary who raised funds for the Irish Republican Army in 1916, had organized an employment agency for new immigrant Cork women, as well as raising funds for the Carmelite religious order - until finally uniting with the Corkmen's Association in 1983 to become the County Cork BP&P Association. Where would we be without the women in our association today? The majority of our events are chaired, co-chaired and orchestrated by Cork women.

I continue reading...about "Cork, the Rebel County" of Michael Collins, of Lord Mayors of Cork: Tomas Mac Curtain and his successor Terence McSwiney depicted and memorialized on the three giant portraits of the Cork hall. Mary Naughton documents the gallant and courageous exploits of the Cork Flying Columns led by Commandment General Tom Barry, and Past President Patrick Hurley pens the amazing history of "The Boys of Kilmichael". We revere the courage of these brave men, as well as our departed member SSG Frank Carvill who died in Operation Iraqi Freedom, serving the New Jersey National Guard. We remember and honor Frank through presenting the "Frank Carvill Distinguished Service Award" at our annual St. Patrick's Dinner Dance.

This 125th Anniversary journal is where we discovered the original name of our newsletter and re-instituted it appropriately: "The Rebel". So the legacy continues in true Rebel Spirit..."For the Boys that beat the Black & Tans were the Boys from the County Cork!"

The County Cork B.P.& P. Association's Annual Scholarship awards will be presented at the Installation of Officers on Sunday, January 19th, 2014. The Scholarship competition is open to members and children of members in good standing as of November 1, 2013. There are two competition levels – Elementary School & High School. The Elementary School applicant must be an eighth grade student graduating into high school in 2014. Elementary School applicant must complete a minimum 500 word essay on "Labor Leader - James Connolly". The High School (College freshman) applicant must have completed high school in 2013, and submit SAT scores for that year. High School applicant must complete a minimum 1000 word essay on "The historical significance of the Dublin Lockout - 1913". An additional scholarship award will be awarded for the High School (College) best essay. Essays must be received by the Cork Association and postmarked no later than January 6th, 2014.

Commodore John Barry Memorial Dedication: Commodore Barry, born in Co. Wexford, is widely credited as "The Father of the American Navy". In 1794, President George Washington made him the first American commissioned naval officer, giving him the title of Commodore. He continued to serve until his death in 1803. A dedication of his memorial monument will take place on Saturday, May 10, at the U.S. Naval Academy in Anapolis, Maryland. The program begins at 9:30 am with a Catholic Mass. The dedication of the memorial will begin at 11:30 am and will feature bagpipes, the U.S.N.A. Color Guard, recognition by naval leaders, both U.S. and Irish government leaders and the AOH and LAOH. A gourmet lunch will follow the dedication. Reservations are needed for the lunch, which costs \$15 per person or \$25 per couple. For more information
